FOOTBALL FRENZY TICKETS

The 2016 Football Frenzy tickets are here and the State has made some BIG changes to the program. Quite possibly the biggest change is more prizes! At least \$2,500 in prizes will be distributed among 23 winners each week or at least \$25,000 over the contest period. The ten week program means that you have 230 chances to win.

The biggest change for the Council is the amount of the ticket sales that will be returned to us. The highest reward comes from selling our entire quota of around 200 tickets. If we make this lofty goal we will NOT have to pay any state per capita tax next year, and we'll get back \$5.50 per ticket rebate. Selling anything less than that, will earn us some percentage of our state per capita tax waved, plus we will still get the \$5.50 per ticket rebate.

PGK Herman Karhoff has once again volunteered to chair this activity, so please see him to get your tickets, both for yourself and to sell to others. Final turn in will be in late October so don't wait too long. We sold over 100 tickets last year, and I'm sure Herman will be looking to add to that this year.

IT'S FUNNEL CAKE TIME

The summer is getting hot, and for our Council that means festivals and funnel cakes. This year we have added another venue, which brings our total to three. The first out of the chute is the Scleroderma Foundation activity on August 6. Then we have the big show, the Fairborn Sweet Corn Festival which is August 20 and 21. Last is the newest show we're trying, The Fairborn Fall Festival, which is October 8 and 9. All of these are important fundraisers for our Council. AUGUST CELEBRATES THE ASSUMPTION OF MARY

August 16, 2016

History

The Assumption of Mary commemorates her ascension into heaven. Traditionally Roman Catholics believe Mary, the Virgin mother of Jesus, never physically died and instead ascended into heaven. Mary, as the mother of God, is believed by some Christian faiths to have lived a life without sin. Some early-church theologians believed that since she and Christ were both without sin that Mary must have raised bodily to heaven just as Christ was. This belief began the feast of the Assumption of Mary.

Facts

The Assumption of Mary isn't in the Bible. The theology it is based upon is from several early church documents and sermons. The Orthodox Church continued the tradition, but it didn't become doctrine in the Roman Catholic Church until 1950 when Pope Pius XII declared the belief infallible. Thomas was the only disciple who purportedly saw Mary's ascension into heaven. In a reversal of his story in scripture, the other disciples didn't believe him at first. Mary dropped her girdle when she reached heaven, and Thomas caught it.

The Feast of the Assumption of Mary is a high feast Day in the Roman Catholic Church and the Orthodox Church. The day venerates the assumption into heaven of Mary, the mother of Jesus. It is held on August 15. In the Orthodox tradition, the feast, called the Dormition of the Theotokos, is held the same date, although the day may be later for churches that follow the Gregorian calendar.
