




December 2022

Happy New Year! Advent begins the Church’s liturgical year. And just like any new year, it is an excellent time to make resolutions. We will be hearing more from Archbishop Schnurr as he leads us further into the three-year Eucharistic Revival sponsored by the United State Conference of Catholic Bishops. To increase devotion of the Eucharist among the faithful, the Archbishop is inviting everyone to participate in a study called The Mass, which is a video series featuring Bishop Robert Barron to begin in January. Please stay tuned for

details. As a penitential season, Advent is an excellent time for the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation, also known as Confession, to prepare well for the celebration of Christmas. In addition to regular confession times found in this bulletin, we will also have an Advent Confession-A-Thon at St. Luke on Wednesday, November 30th from 2-8 PM. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed in Church for quiet prayer and adoration. At least one priest will be available for the sacrament for six hours. At St. Brigid, we will offer confessions after the 9 AM Mass on all the Saturdays of Advent. Please make a plan to bring the family to confession at any parish. Christmas falls on a Sunday this year, so the Mass schedule will be fairly similar to a Sunday with a few additions. As you make your plans for Christmas Mass, I invite you to consider participating at Mass on Christmas Day. The vigil Masses on Christmas Eve tend to become overly crowded in many places. Thanks for your prayers.

Nam Receives the Ministry of Acolyte

Our fourth-year seminarian and brother Knight, Nam Mac, has received the Ministry of Acolyte. The Most Rev. Dennis M. Schnurr, Archbishop of Cincinnati, installed twenty-two Mount St. Mary's Seminary and School of Theology (MTSM) seminarians into the ministry on November 9th, in the Chapel of St. Gregory the Great. Three formal steps are required by the Church prior to being ordained into the diaconate and priesthood. The first step is the Rite of Candidacy at which a man formally states his intention to be formed for ordination. The second is the Ministry of Lector which is a formal recognition of the relationship he is called to have with Sacred Scripture and his willingness to apply himself to its study and proclamation for the good of the Church. The Ministry of Acolyte is the final ministry received prior to ordination as a transitional deacon. It is a formal recognition of the willingness to serve the community, primarily in its liturgical rites. So we join with Nam in thanksgiving. At the November business meeting a note from Nam to the Council was shared. In it, he expressed his thanks to the Fairborn Knights, for remembering his birthday this past October 8th. He also extended his prayers to all the brothers of Fairborn Council.

As the first semester is coming to a close, Nam is preparing for final exams, which take place the week of December 5th. Once exams are over, Nam will fly to California on December 12, to attend his friend's ordination Mass to the priesthood. His friend is a religious brother with the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts. While there, Nam will stay at St. Columban parish, located in the Diocese of Orange. He will return to Cincinnati on December 19. Nam's currently not sure where he will reside through Christmas week, but he'll keep us posted. After Christmas break, Nam will return to seminary to begin his second semester, which begins on January 6th, 2023. Please keep Nam in your prayers.

FALLEN BROTHER



Sir Knight, Brother Paul Yosick passed away on Friday November 4, 2022. Born on February 11, 1926 in Shelby, Ohio, he was the oldest of ten children. Paul is survived by his wife of 73 years, Rosanna and 3 children: Kathy (Steve) Minniear, Gene (Susan) Yosick and Linda (Brian) Shapiro, seven grandchildren and seven great grandchildren. Brother Paul received his first degree on November 1, 1980 and fourth degree on April 1, 1983. He was an Honorary life 42-year member and a Msgr. Buckley Fourth Degree Knight. Brother Paul was the 2012 Blue Coat Volunteer of the Year and 1982-1983 Knight of the Year. As a teenager he was a member of the Columbian Squires. Paul was a very active supporter of the Fairborn Council even before becoming a Knight. Even though Paul was always helping out, he would not officially join the Knights until he retired. As the story goes on the day of his retirement, Brother Knight and boyhood friend from Shelby,

Ohio, Ed Kempf picked up Paul and took him straight to PSD, PGK Bob Wilhelm's house to receive his first degree.

At the old hall, Brother Paul was a fixture: fixing and building and keeping the old furnaces running. Along with wife Rosanna, he worked all of the events including registration at the State Conventions. Paul could build and fix anything and always had the best ideas on how to accomplish a task. An expert woodworker, at one point most of the furnishings at Mary, Help of Christians Church were made by Brother Paul. When the council moved to its present location and learned they could not build a wall in the hallway, it was Paul who suggested the beautiful curtains and proceeded to build the framework while wife Rose sewed the curtains. Even as he aged, Paul could be seen on a ladder or roof, much to Rose's chagrin. Over the years, Brother Paul sponsored a number of Knights including the present Grand Knight. While visiting Paul toward the end, Paul spoke fondly of the Fairborn Knights and all the friendships he made and the love of our Council. He said he never wanted to be Grand Knight as he had enough of leading while working. Little did he know, he was always a leader of the Fairborn Council. Brother Paul's stamp on our council is everywhere and continues to guide us. A recent Saturday work party was dedicated to cleaning and organizing the tool room because that is how Paul would want it. When told of Paul's passing, one Brother Knight commented Brother Paul embodied what a Knight of Columbus is all about. Brother Paul Yosick touched many of us deeply and is a permanent part of the framework of Fairborn Council 3724. Paul now joins our many departed Brother Knights with our respect and thanks.

Consecration to the Holy Family



On Friday, December 30, 2022, the Catholic Church celebrates the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary & Joseph. Council 3724 typically celebrates a Consecration to the Holy Family on the same day. However, since it is not celebrated on a regular Saturday or Sunday Mass this year, the Consecration will be held on 8 January 2023. Council 3724 will be making Consecration to the Holy Family prayer cards available for parishioners at the back of Church before Christmas weekend and after Christmas leading up to the Feast of the Holy Family Sunday. Look for a poster with the image of the Holy Family.

The Knights of Columbus hopes the celebration of this consecration will help strengthen parish families and revitalize parishes. Council 3724 is inviting our Brothers and each Mary, Help of Christians’ family to consecrate themselves to the Holy Family and to devote themselves to the ideal model of familial love set by Jesus, Mary and Joseph. We hope our Brothers will lead by example. Make sure to take a prayer card and say the prayer, composed by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori, with your family daily leading up to the consecration. In the prayer, we ask for the aid or intercession of the perfect son Jesus Christ, Mary the perfect mother, and Joseph who is a model for every father. Although it may be difficult during the Christmas season, families are also asked to intentionally fast from something for the week leading up to the consecration. To fully acknowledge the solemnity of the event, family members are also urged to go to confession during this period.
