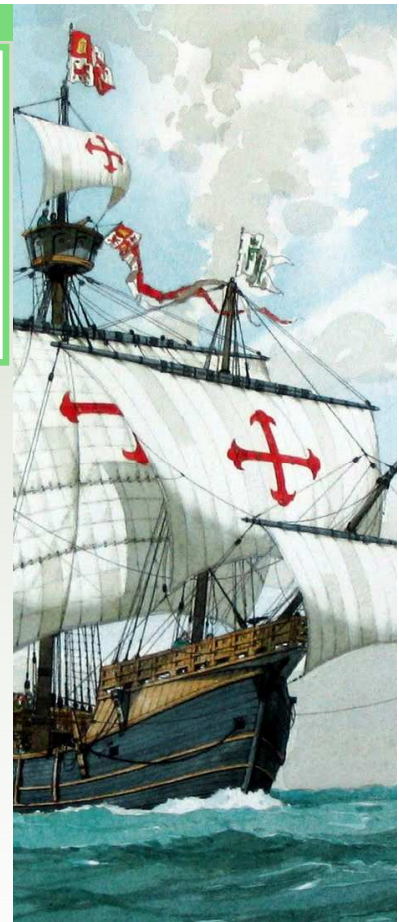
Grand Knight's Corner

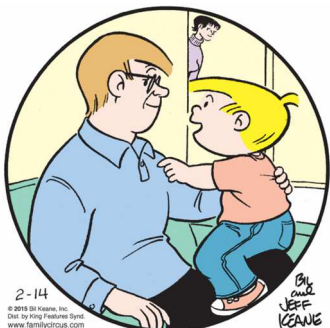
BLUE COAT AWARDS 2018

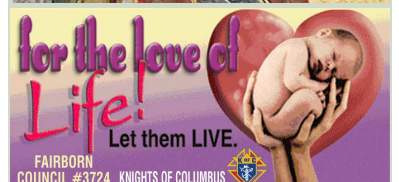

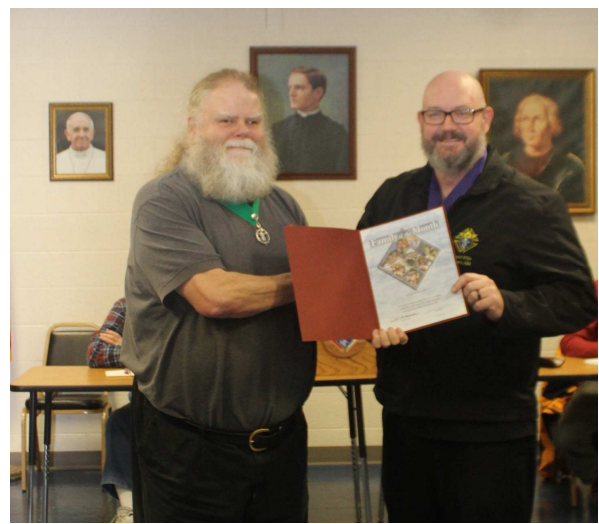
