## Grand Knight's Corner

Well here we are a month into 2020, tax time is coming, we have crested the hill and are heading down to the end of the fraternal year, and although we still have a lot of activities remaining we need to start thinking about next year. So I'm going to take this month to talk about service. Service is the action of helping or doing work for someone. The word service is rooted in the Latin "serv" which is most closely defined as slave, I found that to be a little shocking because it means that many other words, servant, servitude, even the term doing a disservice has that same root. The reason I find that shocking is that I can't think of anyone in the Knights of Columbus, our families, or our parish who would consider the term service any sort of slavery. I willingly serve as your Grand Knight, many of our brothers serve the council in roles small and large and by serving the council, serve the community and the parish. Why am I talking so much about service this month? I am calling on you brother Knights, several of our offices need filling, the Deputy Grand Knight has been vacant this whole year. The Past Grand Knights are going to be putting a mentoring program into effect specifically geared towards pairing a member who chooses to serve an office in the council with a specific mentor who has performed that office to help and guide them along. Some of you will be approached by members of the Past Grand Knights to prayerfully, seriously consider stepping into an officer role. Trust me I've heard the reasons people don't want to do it. I used some of those reasons myself but when I finally said yes, it became one of the most rewarding things I've ever done. I had multiple mentors to help me understand what I was supposed to do and how to do it and no one in our council is ever alone when they take a leadership role.

I recently completed and submitted the fraternal survey that we must turn in every year at this time and I'm am gladdened to share with you that we again had a standout year. Council 3724 is spread across the United States encompassing nearly 260 members. In direct support of those local councils all over, 3724 has donated 64 pints of blood, 2,693 hours of Faith activities, 1,540 hours in support of Family activities, 1,621 hours in support of Community activities, and 375 hours in support of Life activities. We have also provided 98 hours in visits to the sick and bereaved, as well as 50 hours of service to the sick and disabled. Those are just the hours reported on the roughly 60 council surveys that I received. 60 is about 20% of membership, so even accounting for sick and disabled members we could probably add another 10-15% to all those service hours for brothers who didn't send in a survey but still participate in their respective Faith, Family, Community and Life activities. Financially we as a council have contributed over 30,000 dollars in direct charitable donations related to Faith, Family, Community and Life. The first fruit of the Holy Spirit is Charity, coincidence that the same term is the hallmark of the first degree. I don't think so. When you look at the totals that our council contributed in all the program areas, I would say it is self-evident that 3724 is holding true to the lessons of that degree.

We have some pretty big events coming up in February, the second reverse raffle as well as the men's retreat which is coming home to Mary Help and has been opened to the parishes from the base, New Carlisle and the college parishes so it looks to be a great experience. My Knight of the month was Bro. Corky Block our tireless Home Corp president, kitchen crewmember, Tuesday crewmember and all-around huge benefit to the council and to myself. In that vein as well, my Family of the Month was our worthy recorder Tim Barlow, he and his wife Cassie and their family work tirelessly in support of Our Lady Queen of Peace over at the base as well as their other charitable endeavors, yet Tim still finds time to serve as our recorder which could not happen without Cassie's support. Give Corky and Tim a hearty job well done when you see them again.
