Grand Knight's Corner

Well, fraternal year 2020 ended on June 30, going out with quite a whimper. Covid cost us some of our major events such as the Blue Coat Awards, Ladies Night Dinner, Knight of the Year Dinner and nearly every scheduled social activity from March through June. Our new fraternal year commences on July 1 and although the city of Fairborn has cancelled the parade, council 3724 is intending to go ahead with our family picnic on the 4th of July. Food prep is expected to begin around 1pm with eating to occur from 2pm on. I will leave it up to your individual discretion should you want to attend or not but my belief is that the space in the hall coupled with the grass area outside should allow us to maintain all physical distancing as mandated. If you want to wear masks by all means do so, I am going to touch on masks in the latter part of my article but I'd also like to ask that if you are coming and you have any lawn type games that are portable, maybe bring them along.

Despite the challenges of this last fraternal year council 3724 still managed to complete all our Faith, Life, Family and Community goals, and as the Grand Knight, I can't ask for more than that. I have missed seeing all of you, and as I've already mentioned I am grateful to have received the support from the 3724 family that I did because 2020 forced me to make some hard calls in leading this council. I will wait until the August issue to discuss any awards that 3724 receives from State as they themselves are waiting till the July Roadshow to indicate the winners.

Many of you have followed along as I began my journey into the study of Stoicism, I've received some comments, some shared interest and many of you have shared other thoughts with me such as the Jesuit teachings, Franciscan philosophies, the church itself. One suggestion was to look at some monastic teachings which I started to do just before 2020 went to hell in a handbasket. I've looked at three, Saint Francis, Saint Benedict, and Saint Augustine who I will discuss in this issue. According to present evidence, the Rule of Saint Augustine is the oldest monastic rule in the Western Church, written around the year 400 for the community that Saint Augustine established in Hippo. Augustine primarily concerns himself with the overarching values and practices that lead to a community "being of one mind and heart on the way to God" (Acts 4:32). The Rule provides guidance for anyone seeking harmonious and fruitful community life, be it in a family, neighborhood, parish, or work environment. Augustine's rule boiled down basically is.

Be careful with your words: avoid using harsh words, apologize when damage has been done, forgive quickly and ask for forgiveness when needed. Simple but very hard to execute.

Think communally: prioritize the community and not private interests. That is worth thinking about the next time we find ourselves adding up who takes on more household chores, who donates more resources to a cause, and who gives more generously of their time and talents.

I think given the events of the last fraternal year and the still uncertain next, Saint Augustine is worth more exploration? After all, 3724 is a community within itself and to our cities and parishes. The philosopher Plutarch was once asked why the Spartans punished with death the soldier who dropped his shield but not his other protective gear, his answer; "Because helmet and breastplate are worn to protect the individual alone but the shield is borne to protect the whole line."

SUPER CASH BONANZA CHARITY CAMPAIGN

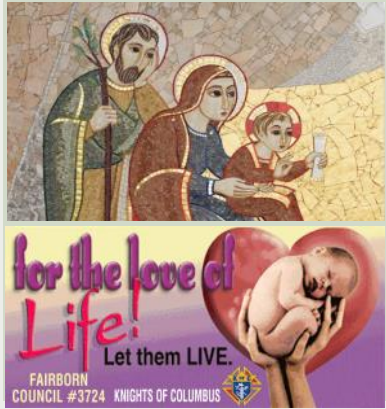

INSURANCE CORNER

Update Your Beneficiaries

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things.

Take, for example, the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it may very well be that the person you originally selected as the beneficiary is no longer the person you would want to receive the policy proceeds. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since married, your policies should be updated to reflect your spouse as beneficiary. Maybe you've had children since, who are not named on the policies.

Most people list a primary beneficiary, who is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary, an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

I routinely call all of my policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy – that is, the date it was originally issued. One of the matters that I'll discuss during this review is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.

I look forward to meeting with each of you to discuss your family's needs.
