Grand Knight's Corner

When we become Knights, we are given the foundation of why Fr. McGivney founded the order, the care of the widows and orphans of the fallen men. Outside of the immediate surroundings of his small parish and community and his experiences there. I've often wondered if his inspiration came from some part of scripture as well. Maybe just hanging around in the back of his mind as he went about his daily tasks. Then this weekend I was reading a little in the bible and I happened to come across this passage. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple there whom he loved, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold your son." Then he said to the disciple, "behold your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his home. John 19:26-27. If that is not a biblical foundation for what we are, I don't know what else would be. I honestly can't think of a more terrifying and alarming time in life than what is happening right now in the US and in a larger extent the world. Fear, Paranoia, Rage, and Heartbreak abound, yet sprinkled throughout are small moments of kindness that indicate maybe we aren't completely done as a society. I think it's okay to be scared after all it's a natural reaction to being surprised or thrown back by a blow from fate but what we can't do is allow that fear to control our lives we need to gather ourselves up and keep going, especially in a global pandemic in which all people have been utterly failed by their governments. Fear can be useful if channeled into a solution, but we cannot let fear lead us into anger. As Knights we need to be seen acting out of Christ's love for all and Fr. McGivney's intentions for the Knights role as defenders. Seneca stated that "the effects of anger are almost always worse than the harm from the violation." A lesser known stoic Athenodorus stated that, "we have to count the letters of the alphabet and gather ourselves before we do or say something we regret." That sounds an awful lot like my dad in the back of my head saying, "Count to 10 Son." As Knights of Columbus we must focus our energy productively—on keeping ourselves and our families safe, on keeping our businesses going, on keeping our local communities going. Being mad is a reaction. Anger is a state of mind. One is outside our control. The other is something we choose—a weakness we give into and accept. So, let's continue to do what's best for our communities and our families.

DEFENDING OUR NAMESAKE Part 1.

With the cancel culture running rampant, the schools teaching alternative history our namesake under constant attack, I have found it a struggle to come up with on the spot defenses of Columbus. I believe he was a good man at heart but flawed like all of us. As I'm sure many of you have also experienced, I have found myself on the receiving end a couple of times of vitriol from younger members of my family who are buying into this media bias against him. So, I started looking for anything and everything I can get my hands on to at least give them some more information to ponder. I thought that might be something we could all use. Not that we should necessarily become Columbian Scholars but at least have some basic points to buffer the attack. Supreme recently sent out a Knightline that I will be pulling heavily from. There is a massive amount of literature on Christopher Columbus, but for the most part there are generally five charges leveled against his character. He was a violent man; He committed genocide; He instituted the slave trade; He had only worldly interests and He did not accomplish anything extraordinary. I've decided to address each but over the next five editions of the newsletter.

Charge #1 Against the Character of Christopher Columbus. He was a violent man.

One person who knew Columbus personally was the Dominican missionary Bartolomé de las Casas. He earned the name defensor de los indios ("defender of the Indians") because of his passionate diatribes against exploiters of native peoples in the Americas. Las Casas did not spare Columbus from criticism, but he also defended him against those who blamed him for all the disorders and violence that followed the first contacts with Indigenous peoples. The great explorer's missteps, he said, were the result of ignorance and misjudgments about how to proceed: "Truly, I would not dare blame the admiral's intentions for I knew him well and I knew his intentions were good."

Las Casas spoke of Columbus' "sweetness and benignity." Far from being a violent man, he often got into difficulties because he would be indulgent — toward natives and Spaniards — and would then take extreme measures against both when things got out of hand. He was a great navigator but a poor governor. By his third voyage, he was cautioning Ferdinand and Isabella about who they were allowing to sail to the New World. He needed, he said, 60 missionaries to preach Christianity to arrogant and abusive Spaniards, and another 60 upstanding men to help him run the colony.

So, yes he was flawed like all of us are but if this man Las Casas who knew him personally and wrote about him at length did not consider him violent why should we. In November I will discuss the 2nd charge levied against Columbus's character, "Genocide."

FOOTBALL CRAZR

The Covid-19 pandemic continues to impact our council as we have had to cancel the Reverse Raffle usually held in October and one of our best fundraisers. I mentioned earlier that the State Council's Football CraZR might be one of our only chances to really maintain our ability to fund some of our programs in 2020-2021. The program involves the last 10 weeks of games played by the NFL this season. Games played between Nov 1, 2020 and Jan 3, 2021.
