Grand Knight's Corner

Brothers,

August was another busy month for our council. A big Thank You to all the volunteers who worked another successful Sweet Corn Festival. We also facilitated a cookout at the Wright State Chapel after their 11:00 Mass. This is their annual welcome back for students, faculty and families. It was very well attended with close to 100 people there. Brother Mark Dues set up the new K of C banner with Father McGivney's picture on it. We did have one transfer and several prospects.

Pilgrimage continuation.

From Lourdes we traveled by bus to Toulouse where Father Martin said Mass at the Basilica de St Sernin, the largest Romanesque church in Europe. From there we traveled to the double walled castle of Carcassonne. The walls of this huge impressive medieval castle are 1.9 miles around. Inside the walls there is the Basilica of Saints Nazarius & Celsus, a beautiful church that has one of the oldest stained-glass windows in France.

Our next stop was the ancient village of Rocamadour. Named after St. Amadour, as he established a Hermitage there. In 1166, an incorruptible body was found, believed to be his. This discovery propelled Rocamadour to become one of the 4 most important pilgrimage sites in medieval Christendom, attracting Kings and paupers alike. The village is on the valley floor with 216 steps up the cliff wall to the churches built into the cliff there. I remember 5 Chapels but the web page says there are 8. Father Martin said Mass for us in the Chapelle Notre Dame which displays the Vierge Noire statue (Black Madonna). The statue was carved from the wood of a walnut tree in the 12th century and has turned black. The Black Madonna has drawn worshippers from all over Europe in search of miracles. Hanging from the ceiling there is a 9th century iron bell that is said to ring on its own when, somewhere in the world, the Virgin performs a miracle.

Many recorded miracles are linked to sailors in peril at sea, hence the boats hanging from the ceiling. It is quite impressive and hard to imagine how they constructed everything.

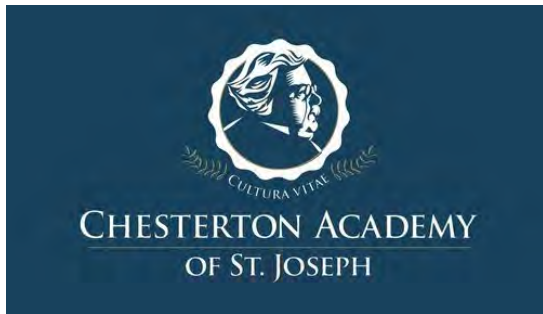
Any3 Things Podcast with Fr. Ambrose

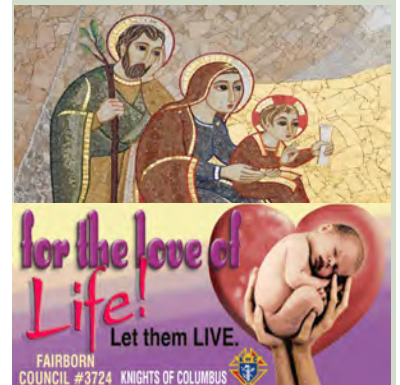

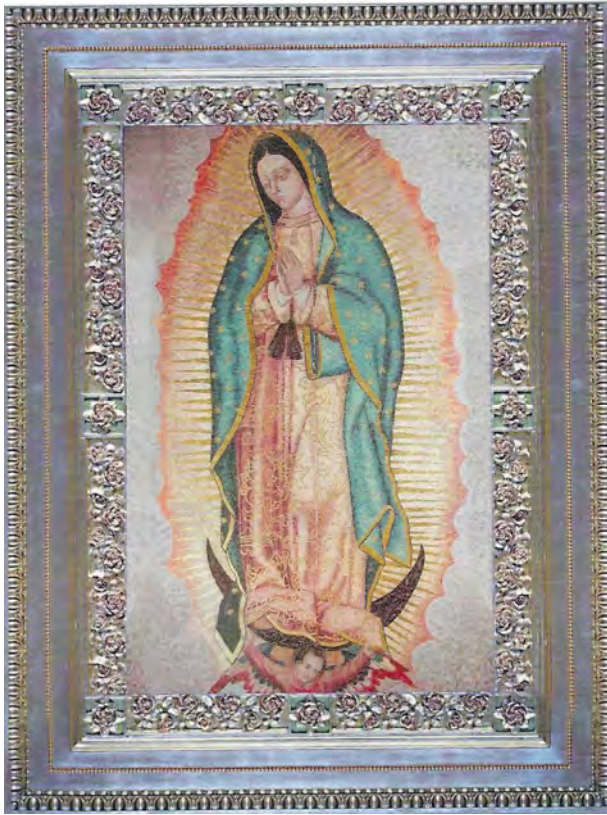

Four parts of retirement: Phase One
