Rocamadour continued

In a crevice in the cliff wall above the Chapel of Notre Dame Vierge Noire there has been a sword stuck in the rock for over 1300 years. This sword as legend would have it, was given to Charlemagne by an Angel. Charlemagne gave it to his top officer Roland. As Roland was dying he threw it as far as he could to keep the Muslims from capturing it. It traveled over 100 miles and stuck in the cliff of Rocamadour where it supposedly has remained for 1300 years. On the night of June 21, it was stolen. Not an easy task as it was about 30 ft up the cliff wall. I was there on June 1 and have a picture to prove it was there then. It is rumored that the sword is not the original and has been replaced several times over the 1300 years. Several blacksmiths have offered to make a new one to replace it. I find all these stories interesting and the history behind them fascinating.

Next we traveled to Paray Le Monial. The hotel we stayed in was across the street from a church celebrating the 350th anniversary of Jesus revealing his Sacred Heart to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque. The church was built to honor His Sacred Heart. After Mass there was a Eucharistic Procession that went for several blocks and ended with Benediction at a very large Romanesque Basilique built in the 14th century that was literally just down the street from the church the procession started at. The procession had about 100 people saying the rosary and singing in French and many people observing along the way.

Our next stop was just overnight in Nevers on our way to Charters.

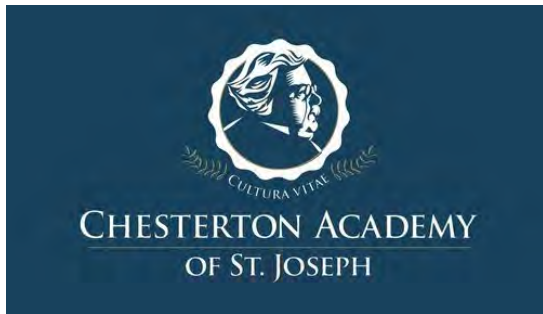
Any3 Things Podcast with Fr. Ambrose

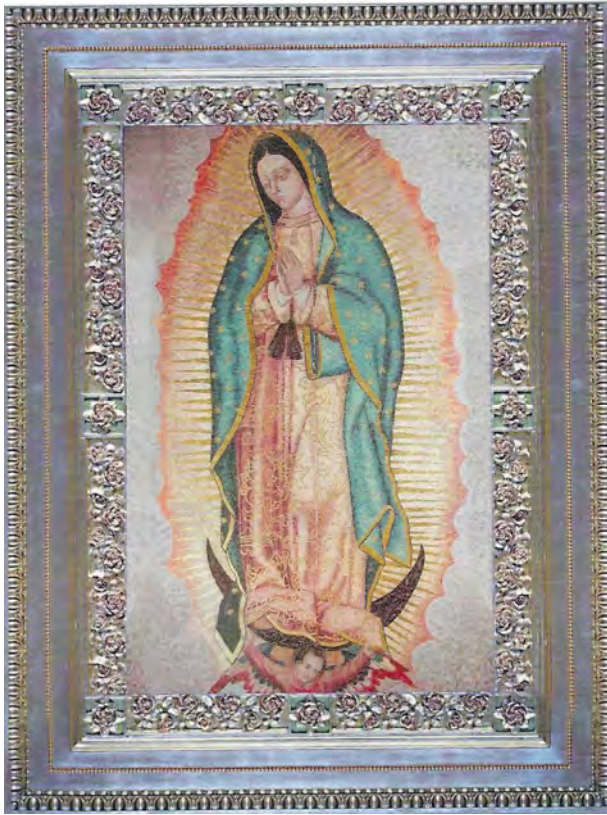


Knights in Action
