## Grand Knight's Corner

Brothers,

I need to back up a day, to our stay in Nevers. In the morning, we visited the convent of the Sisters of Charity. At the age of 22(1866) Saint Bernadette of Lourdes took her vows as a Sister of Charity in Nevers. She had become so popular in Lourdes that she had to leave. At the convent she took care of the sick Sisters, but she also became sick and at the age of 35 died of bone cancer. She was buried in a small chapel on the grounds of the convent. After her beatification in 1925 they moved her body to the main chapel. We were able to visit both Chapels.

We arrived late afternoon in Lisieux at the Ermitage (Monastery) of Saint Terese where we stayed the next 2 nights. The ermitage is run by the Carmelite Sisters. Their convent is next door to the ermitage. This is where Saint Terese of Lisieux, also known as The Little Flower, was a nun.

Her parents Louis and Zelig Martin are the only couple to be Beatified and Canonized together in the history of the church. Her mother died when she was 4. She was raised by her father and 2 older sisters. When she was 15 she pleaded with her father to let her enter the convent. She was too young according to the rules but her Bishop relented and let her enter. She joined her 2 older sisters and a 4th sister joined them after their Father died. She was only there 9 years, dying at the age of 24 in 1879 of tuberculosis. Her Mother Superior asked her to write her autobiography.

Thanks to her writings entitle "Story of a Soul", published a year after her death, Terese became rapidly known and loved throughout the world. She was Canonized in 1925. Named second Patron Saint of France in 1944. and a Doctor of the Church in 1997. Only 1 of 3 women given that title. Remarkable for only being on earth 24 years.

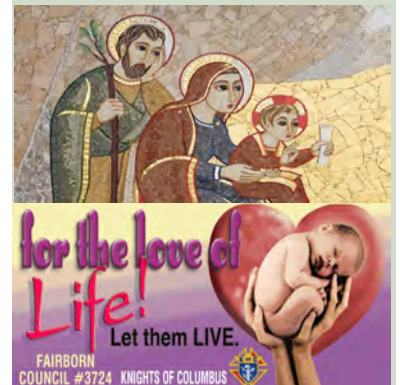
