Grand Knight's Corner

Brothers,

We arrived in Paris late afternoon and checked into our hotel. We had a nice group dinner at a nearby Italian restaurant. One of our fellow pilgrims suggested we take a river boat ride on the Seine River. We made our way via public transportation down to the river, very close to the Eiffel tower. We boarded the river boat about dusk. It was a cool but very pleasant evening. The boat traveled downstream past Notre-Dame. Notre-Dame is actually on a 56 acre island in the middle of the Seine named Ile de la cite. The boat turned and headed upstream on the opposite side of the island. There are a great number of landmarks and important buildings along the river. By now they were all illuminated and very scenic, there is a tremendous amount of nightlife along the river with many, many people walking along it and enjoying the evening.

The next day we started with Mass at The Chapel of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medel. Father Martin had the privilege of saying Mass for us and a number of others at the main Alter. This chapel was built in 1815 and is still home to the Daughters of Charity, an order founded by Saint Vincent de Paul. It was in this very Chapel that The Blessed Virgin appeared 3 times to Saint Catherine Laboure in 1830. When Catherine was 9 her mother died, shortly after she stood in front of a statue of Our Lady in her home and said, "Now dear Blessed Mother, you will be my mother." When Mary appeared to her, She asked Catherine to have a medal created and gave her the images for both sides of it. Mary told her **FOR THOSE WHO WEAR IT WITH CONFIDANCE, THERE WILL BE ABUNDANT GRACE.** Catherine only told her confessor Father Aladel about all of this. He was not receptive to her message and forbad her to even think about it. This was a terrible blow for her. Catherine let a little time pass then spoke to Father Aladel again about The Blessed Virgin's request. He must have been more receptive this time.

In February of 1832 a terrible outbreak of cholera hit Paris and caused 20,000 deaths. In June of the same year the Daughters of Charity began distributing 2000 medical that they had made at Father Aladel's request. Cures accumulated as did protection from the disease and conversions. The people of Paris began to call the medal miraculous.

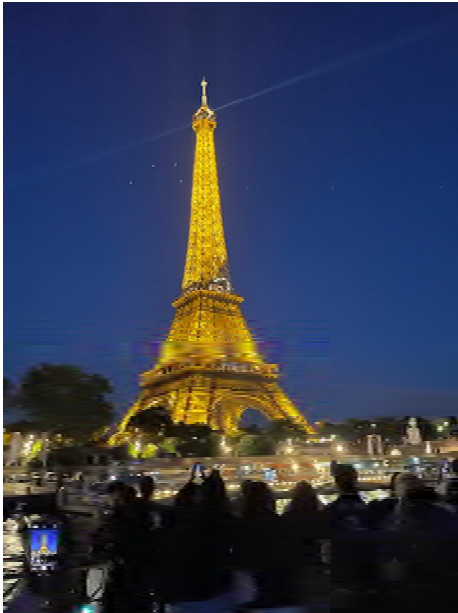

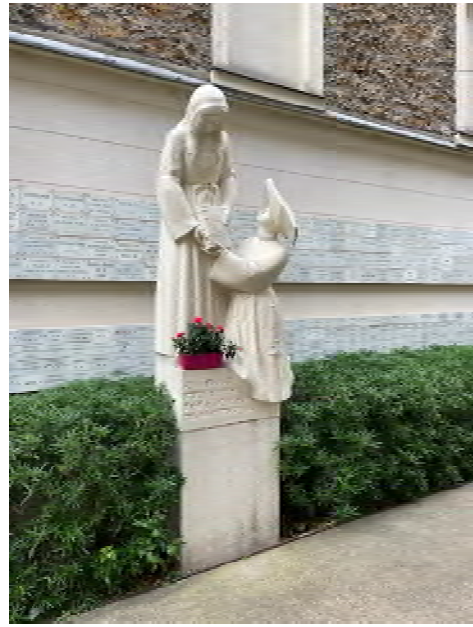
Grand Knight's Column (cont.)

Saint Catherine kept all of this between herself and her Confessor Father Aldel even though she knew that countless miracles were being performed because of the medal. Shortly before her death in 1876 she told her Mother Superior that she was the Sister of the Miraculous Medal. At that time there were more than a BILLION medals around the world. Today it is the most well known and worn medal in the world. Shortly after her death her Superior broke the news that Sister Catherine was the one that had seen and touched the Blessed Virgin Mary. She was canonized a Saint by Pope Pius XII in 1947.

If you would like a Miraculous medal for yourself or someone else, I have them for the asking and it would be my honor to give you one. To be continued.

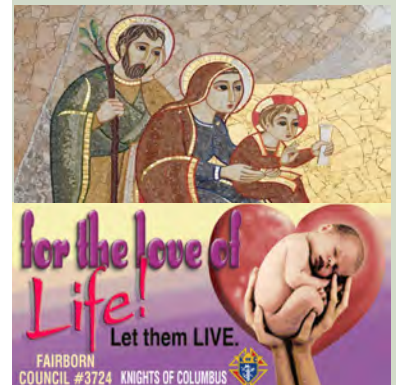

Ohio Charities Super Cash Bonanza 2024

The Ohio Charities campaign is underway and will once again provide a decent return to our council in money we can use locally. The tickets are \$5.00 with the council retaining \$2.40 of every ticket sold. The state chairman is also authorizing some additional incentives for making early turn ins etc. The drawing will be held at the State Convention in Cleveland May of 2025. Prize winners will be published in the June 2023 Santa Maria. Your hard work last year helped 3724 sell over 1300 tickets, netting the council over \$4,700. Some of the charities we supported are; Food for Families, 2nd Harvest Food Bank, St. Vincent DePaul, Coats for Kids, Family and Youth Initiatives, various Right to Life activities including sponsoring the Right to Life Wash DC trip and various Veteran's program.

The all-important first phase of the campaign has begun. Ten tickets were mailed out to each registered member of 3724 on Feb 15th so you should be receiving your tickets shortly if you haven't already. It is critical that we sell/buy as many tickets as possible before the first state turn-in date. These tickets net the council the biggest rebate. Final turn in for the first phase will be Thursday March 20, 2025, so we can make the deadline. The final turn in for phase 2 will be Thursday May 1, 2025 so we can make the May cutoff prior to the convention. Tickets can be turned in any Thursday night at the Hall, at Bingo, or mailed to 934 N Maple Ave, Fairborn, OH 45324.

INSURANCE CORNER



SIMPLE THINGS

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things. Take the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it could very well be that the beneficiary originally designated to receive the proceeds from that policy needs to be updated. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since been married, that could be updated to reflect your spouse, and even your children. Most people list a primary beneficiary – that person is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary – an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured. I routinely call all of our policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy – the date it was originally issued. One of the matters that I'll discuss during this review is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment. I look forward to meeting with each of you. Give me a call.
