## Grand Knight's Corner

Brothers,

Robert from the bed & breakfast in Domremy took us to the train station for our return trip to Paris. Both the trains from and back to Paris were high speed trains that traveled 100 to 120 miles/hour. They were extremely smooth and quiet, a very nice way to travel.

From the train station in Paris, we took the subway to Sacre-Coeur Basilica (Basilica of the Sacred Heart). There is a guest house attached to the Basilica run by the Benedictine Sisters of the Sacred Heart. Father Martin shared a very small room for the next 2 nights, at most 10x10 feet with a small bath on the end. After checking in Father Martin, Nick and I walked to a nearby restaurant and enjoyed a nice dinner, seated outside with very pleasant weather.

This was our second visit to the Basilica. It is rather new being dedicated in 1919, but construction was not completed until 1824. It was first proposed in 1870 after the defeat of Napoleon III in the Franco-Prussian war, the Catholic Archbishop of Paris convinced the French Government to build a Church dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus as a symbol of national reconciliation for the perceived moral decline of France. France had lost the Franco-Prussian (German) war and had a civil war following that.

Construction began in 1875 on the highest point in Paris. The site is named Montmartre (mountain of martyrs) The first Bishop of Paris was beheaded there along with several companions in the 3rd century. It is said that after being beheaded he stood up, picked up his head and continued preaching while walking 2 miles.

It is a beautiful Basilica with a view of Paris that is only surpassed by the view from the Eiffel Tower. There are 270 steps leading up to the Church and if you don't want to climb them there is an incline railway you can take. There has been uninterrupted prayer since 1885 as there is continuous adoration of the Blessed Eucharist, 24 hours a day. I attended the 10:00 pm Mass both nights and was impressed with the attendance for a Mass that late in the evening. There were at least 250 people in attendance.

The Basilica is known for its Christ in Glory mosaic, the largest in France and one of the largest in the world. It depicts the resurrected Christ with a golden heart surrounded by many saints including The Virgin Mary, St Michael the Archangel and St Joan of Arc. It is in the dome over the main altar and measures 5112 square feet. The Basilica also has the largest bell in France. It's almost 10 feet across, 30 feet around and weighs 19 tons. I did not see the bell, but the mosaic is truly impressive. Vivat Jesus, Tom

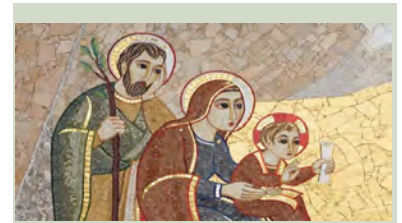

## 2025 SWEET CORN KING & QUEEN *LAUREL & BETSY MAYER*



### **This Years King of the 2025 Sweet Corn Festival is Laurel Mayer.**

Laurel was born and raised in a rural village of Niles (now the city of Fremont) , California. He graduated from Washington Union High School in 1954, and San Jose State College in 1958. In 1958 he was commissioned into the United States Air Force. He served in several assignments to include Grissom AFB, Yokota, Japan, Offutt AFB, Defense Intelligence Agency, Vietnam, then Wright Patterson AFB for 18 years until his retirement in 1988. In 1970, he made his home in Fairborn and served at Wright Patterson AFB (FTD, AFIT, DISAM, and finally as Director of Intelligence for AFLC). He was awarded 14 military medals and awards, including the Legion of Merit and a Bronze Star (earned in Vietnam). After retiring from USAF, he became a Professor at Sinclair College for 35 years, being elected to become Professor Emeritus when he stepped down from full-time teaching in 2013. Fairborn has been the Mayer's hometown now for 55 years., with three children graduates of Fairborn High School. Laurel has been active in Fairborn programs during those years (including 20 years on Planning Board, 10 years on Parks Board, Fairborn Athletic Boosters, Fairborn City and School Levy Committees, St. Vincent de Paul food deliveries, Fairborn Education Foundation, Ushering at Wright State and is a Greene County Veterans Commissioner. He has been selected for both the Greene County and Ohio State Veterans Hall of Fame. He is also an active supporter of Fairborn scholarships, Fairborn's Military History Museum, and Fairborn Christmas Project.

### **The 2025 Sweet Corn Queen is Betsy Mayer.**

Betsy was born and raised in Peru, Indiana. After graduating from high school, she enrolled in Indiana University (Kokomo) She became engaged to Laurel in 1961 and married in 1962. It was off to Japan (literally halfway around the World), space available, since Laurel's orders to Japan came before they were married. She quickly adjusted to living in an off base: "paddy house". (No telephone, no television), driving on the wrong side of the road, etc. She adjusted well, teaching English to Japanese students, Professional modeling, including fashion shows at Tokyo's Imperial Hotel. For decades her years were filled with hosting and showing area highlights to visiting family and friends (Boys Town, SAC Hq while in Nebraska), U.S Capitol, White House (1966-69), living in D, C., Hawaii 1980-83. They bought their first home in Fairborn in 1970 and have called Fairborn home ever since. Betsy has been involved in community activities during all these years, including volunteering at Five Points Elementary, delivering food for St. Vincent de Paul. and volunteering for various school and community support programs.

## 2025 FOOTBALL FRENZY

Hello, my brother knights and welcome to the 2025-2026 fraternal year. As always at this time of year the Ohio State Council K of C kicks off the Football Sweepstakes. This year the games will be played between late October through December/January. Donation is \$20.00 per ticket.

\$25,000 in prizes will be awarded over the contest period and a winners' list will be posted on [www.fundcrazr.com](http://www.fundcrazr.com) and [www.kofcoho.org](http://www.kofcoho.org) – Password is going to your ticket number.

Last year 3724 sold 203 tickets which netted the council a \$1,400 rebate, and a \$470.00 credit off our state per capita bill. So instead of a \$1300 bill the council only had to write a \$800 dollar check for per capita. Grand Knight Pitstick is hopeful that we can repeat that success again this year.

As with all the years before, if we do not make any quota and just participate, we get 0% per capita credit and a \$5.50 rebate for each ticket. If every member is responsible for 1 ticket, we can break last year's number. I am asking all brothers to be responsible for 3 tickets, buy one, sell two, buy two or sell one and we can crush that number. As always participation is optional but when we sell more tickets, we do get credit from the state office.

We have once again utilized a mail campaign to make sure all members have a chance to participate. Some of you may receive additional tickets from the State Chairman PSD Gary Eckstein. Please don't get upset if you do. You can just toss them or sell/buy them your choice, if you do buy them just put 3724 in the council box and we will still get credit for the ticket.

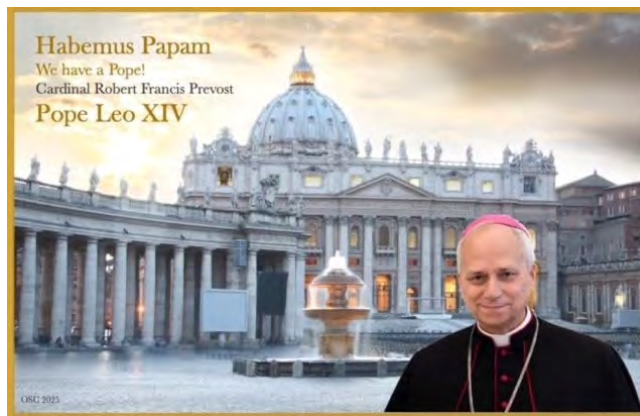
**Tuesday morning crew activities (August):** General maintenance, cleaning, empty trash cans, etc.
